

Programs ☆

As part of the registration process, campers will select four daily activities from three core areas:

1) Waterfront

Our highly-trained and certified staff provides campers with instruction and the opportunity to improve their skills in swimming, small craft boating (including kayaks) and aquatic ecology.

2) Challenge! Activities..Camp Leslie Style!

This area includes activities such as Archery, Rocketry, Sports, Outdoor Living Skills ("Survivor") and Nature Studies. This year camp has upgraded its ropes course with NEW high elements to further challenge campers!

3) Creative Arts

Our talented staff will provide programs in Dance Instruction, Drama and Arts & Crafts. Campers will have the opportunity to share their progress with the camp community as part of the Candlelight Ceremony.

Team Competition

Camp is divided into two teams and week-long competitions revolve around the theme week activities, ending with the Candlelight Ceremony.

Evening Program

All overnight campers participate in activities such as Skit Night, Carnivals, Special Theme Week Events and the Thursday Night Dance.

Candlelight Ceremony

Parents and visitors are welcome to come to camp after 5:00 pm on the Friday of their child's camp week. Please provide you and your child with dinner and join the camp activities. The highlight of each week's activities is the Candlelight Ceremony from 5:45 p.m. - 6:45 p.m. The 4-H and Spirit Award winners are honored at a ceremony at the fire circle.

Overnight Camp ○

Our overnight camp is open to all children ages 7-14. Campers attend Sunday through Friday and are housed, according to age, in cabins with bunk bed style sleeping arrangements. The daily schedule includes opportunities for campers to participate in activities in their smaller cabin groups.

CIT Program ✌

The CIT (Counselor-In-Training) Program is designed for all campers who are **14 years old by July 1, 2010**. It provides participants with the necessary skills and knowledge to be a summer camp counselor. The program covers such topics as leadership, conflict resolution and group dynamics. CIT positions are filled based on the discretion of the camp director on a first come first served basis. **The CIT program requires a separate application. Please call the camp or visit our website to request the form.**

Day Camp 🌻

Our integrated Day Camp Program is open to all children ages 7-14. Campers attend Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Extended day camp hours are available from 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. The Day Camp Staff will meet your child in front of the office each day to sign them in and each evening to sign them out. Campers join a cabin group for the day, participating in all camp activities. Lunch is provided by the camp. Breakfast and Dinner is provided to those campers registered for the extended day camp program.

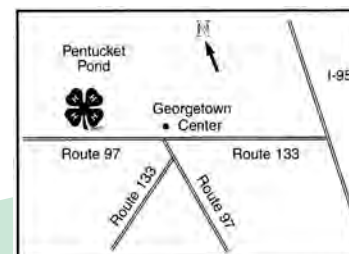
The camp fees (including deposit) are as follows:
Residential Camp: \$470 per week. CIT Program: \$350 per week. Day Camp rate is \$295 for standard hours and an additional \$50.00 for extended hours. Register before March 1, 2010 and receive \$30 off per week per child. A camp T-shirt is included with the cost of registration.
